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
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LETTER FROM THE **FOUNDERS**





The Able Faith Center serves as the operational and programmatic epicenter of our organization, dedicated to enhancing the lives of individuals with neurological disabilities and their caregivers. Beyond its function as an administrative headquarters, the facility is a dynamic environment designed to facilitate support, engagement, and empowerment.

The center's architecture and interior layout have been developed to ensure full accessibility, promoting ease of use for all visitors. It houses a training facility equipped with state-of-the-art assistive technologies, enabling us to conduct a wide array of rehabiliative and skill-building programs.

The Able Faith center hosts monthly events, which are integral to our community outreach and support initiatives. These events are tailored to foster inclusivity and provide connection opportunities in a setting that encourages social interaction and community building.



PROGRAMS & SERVICES



CONNECTION EVENTS

A welcoming space to increase courage, build confidence, and connect with others. Able Faith events are designed to provide a sense of community and offer a soultion to the social stigmas that can accompany physical disabilities.



QUALITY OF LIFE GRANTS

Financial support for people in the Able Faith community who are experience a hardship paying for necessary expenses, including but not limited to, medical supplies, adaptive medical equipment, or unexpected life events. Eligibility requirements apply.



RESPITE CARE

A night off for caregivers from shopping for groceries, cooking, and washing dishes and allows for some much-needed personal time. This is provided through "Share the Care" or Respite family-style dinners.



ADAPTIVE TRAINING

Specialized training for individuals facing nuerological disabilities aimed at increased mobility and increase independence. A wholistic apporach to empower both the mind and the body, while allowing caregivers a mini-reprive.



SOCIAL OUTINGS

Designed to help combat the isolation that people with physical disabilities and their caregivers can experience from not connecting with others in the community. The outings provide opportunities to connect with others and build lasting relationships to help encourage one another.



THE PROBLEM

Living with a neurological disability comes with a spectrum of challenges that extend far beyond paralysis. Including, but not limited to:

- · Chronic pain
- · Organ dysfunction
- Respiratory complications
- Mental Health Struggles

Living with a neurological disability entails a complex interplay of physical, social, and financial obstacles. Including, but not limited to:

- Limited Employment Opportunities
- · Economic Instability
- Adaptive Equipment & Home Modification
- Discrimination in Education and Community Life

Able Faith exist to provide direct and indirect access to resources and support via solutions that:

- Support Caregivers and offer respite
- Foster Connection and bring people together
- Empower individuals to actively participate in their care
- Combat isolation and mental health issues
